Brief History

Development of Shinfield, Spencers Wood and Three Mile Cross

In Shinfield Parish, the villages of Shinfield, Spencers Wood and Three Mile Cross are being extended and together comprise one of our major development areas.

There will be homes, a district centre with a supermarket and community centre, a neighbourhood centre, two new primary schools, new playing fields and open spaces, and new roads which includes the Shinfield Eastern relief road. The University of Reading has also built the Thames Valley Science and Innovation Park which is accessed from the Shinfield Eastern Relief Road.

History of Three Mile Cross

Basingstoke Road was the historic route south from the Thames Valley at Reading to Odiham, Farnham, and Portsmouth. The not very fertile land was held by large estates and the medieval open-field system was only enclosed by hedging in the nineteenth century. The estates and farms depended on labourers and servants who lived in poor conditions on the common land or in sporadic clusters of dwellings. Ale houses and coaching inns served the travellers on the main road, and Three Mile Cross developed at the junction with the then chief route east to Shinfield parish church and on to Wokingham, and the route west to Grazeley and Mortimer. Tradesmen and services for agriculture were attracted to Three Mile Cross. By the 1820's the community of farriers, bakers, cobblers, seamstresses and others formed a bustling village that was brilliantly depicted in the series of articles entitled 'Our Village', written over many years by the resident dramatist and author Mary Russell Mitford. The articles made Three Mile Cross so famous that American visitors would come here to look at the village and make Mary Mitford's acquaintance.

Bus Travel

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Forget about the parking costs and rising fuel prices and let someone else do the driving

Basingstoke Road Bus Stops

From Deer Leap Park and Orchard Rise you can catch the No. 9 Leopard bus to reach Reading train station via Royal Berkshire Hospital and Whitley Wood. The nearest bus stop is located on the Basingstoke Road opposite Three Mile Cross Post Office.

Average journey times to Reading are around 35 minutes.

For fares and for further information on the Leopard 9 see the enclosed leaflet.

Tiger 7 also serves Reading train station and takes around 35 minutes.

In the opposite direction the Tiger 7 serves Swallowfield, Wellington Country Park, Hartley Wintney and Fleet train station. Average journey times to Fleet train station are around 35 minutes.

Park and Ride to Reading

A park and ride service operates from Mereoak Park & Ride at Mereoak Lane, Grazeley. The site provides nearly 600 parking spaces, plus cycle and motorcycle parking. Reading Buses, Greenwave service provides a fast and frequent service between the site and Reading town centre and Reading train station. Park and ride fares include a parking fee of £1.00 per day. Concessionary passes are valid for bus travel in accordance with the scheme conditions, but pass-holders will be asked to pay a £1.00 parking fee.

Long Distance Coaches

National Express operate coaches to London Victoria Coach Station as well as Heathrow and Gatwick Airports from Mereoak Park & Ride. Please note that there is no overnight parking at Mereoak.

Rail travel is a faster, more relaxing and less stressful way to travel on business, and it's easy and hassle-free for leisure trips with your family and friends


Brief History

Trains from Reading station travel to stations all over the country including London Paddington, Gatwick, Birmingham New Street and Bournemouth. In addition, the rail air bus departs from Reading station travelling direct to Heathrow. Reading station is located on Station Approach, RG1 1LZ. There are 344 bicycle storage spaces and 1,275 parking spaces located at the station. It takes approximately 30 minutes to cycle to Reading Station from Deer Leap Park & Orchard Rise.

Catch the No. 7/9 bus from the Basingstoke Road bus stop to Reading train station. Reading Buses Greenwave service also travels to Reading train station from Mereoak Park & Ride in 20-25 minutes.

Mereoak Park & Ride

For Reading Town Centre, Reading International Business Park, Kennet Island & Madejski Stadium

Mereoak Park and Ride is a 5 minute drive from Deer Leap Park & Orchard Rise and accessed via Mereoak Lane. Journey times to Reading are 15-25 minutes.

A parking fee of £1 per car for day users applies to Mereoak Park and Ride and is included in the bus ticket. Concessionary pass holders travel on the bus for free but need to buy a £1 per car parking ticket on the bus. No overnight parking is permitted.
