Brief History

The North Wokingham major development site is an urban extension of Wokingham town, on land adjoining the Kentwood and Matthewsgreen neighbourhoods and Keephatch Beech (Keephatch Gardens). As part of the new development, there are several new recreational open spaces for residents to enjoy the natural environment. These open spaces include parks and gardens, public open spaces, children's play areas, playing pitches, allotments and nature parks.

The development at Keephatch Gardens has some allotments and a noise-reducing hill with a fence along the A329M.

A pub and restaurant, The Oakingham Belle, opened its doors in September 2019. It is located on Oak Avenue on the right hand side of the entrance to Keephatch Gardens off the London Road. The pub was named after a local Wokingham barmaid from the 18th century 'Molly Mogg' who was also known as the Oakingham Belle.

London Road Bus Stops

The Lion 4/X4 bus service travels between Reading and Bracknell every 15 minutes. Buses towards Reading provide an excellent service to Wokingham Station and the Holt, Forest, Emmbrook and St Crispin's Schools.

Journey times to the Southern Industrial Estates on the Lion 4 are less than 10 minutes and journey times to Bracknell's Lexicon Shopping Centre are 15 minutes via the Lion X4.

Your nearest bus stops for the Lion services are the Hilton St Anne's Manor Hotel stops on the London Road.

Park and Ride to Reading

The Winnersh Triangle Park & Ride site is currently being improved with additional spaces and more electric vehicle chargepoints. The Winnersh Triangle car park (reduced capacity of 100 during construction) will still be in use for those using the train service.

There is a park & ride facility at Mere oak just off the A33, J11 M4 with regular buses going into Reading.

Rail travel is a faster, more relaxing and less stressful way to travel on business, and it's easy and hassle-free for leisure trips with your family and friends

Wokingham is the nearest railway station to Keephatch Gardens. It takes approximately 15 minutes to cycle to the station. Alternatively you can catch the 4/X4 Lion bus which departs from the London Road bus stop every 15 minutes.

Four trains an hour depart from Reading Station, two direct trains an hour to London Waterloo and two direct trains an hour to Guildford, Redhill and Gatwick Airport. Some additional services are provided at peak times.

The station is located on Station Approach, RG40 2AP. It has a cafe, 118 sheltered cycle storage spaces and 531 parking spaces.



Approximate Journey Times



Twyford Train Station is approximately 10 minutes by car or 25 minutes by bike. There are regular trains to London Paddington from Twyford with journey times varying from as quick as 21 minutes depending on when you travel. You can also catch the Elizabeth line train to London from Twyford Station which will provide more flexibility for travel to London.

Electric Vehicles

Electric vehicles are better for the environment, cheaper to run and cheaper to maintain.

Pure electric vehicles have zero exhaust emissions, which means they do not emit any harmful exhaust emissions in the local environment.

Depending on your electricity deal and how efficient your electric car is, you could drive for as little as 2-5p per mile. Electric charging points are provided locally in the Carnival Pool and Shute End Car Parks.
